### Worship

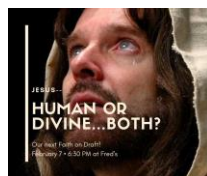

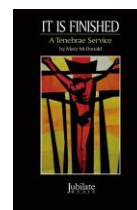


### February Bible Study for Adults
